### **Race Results**

#### ***9 Sept., 'Lakes Bikes' Age Div., Wandii***

Conditions were almost perfect for 50 riders who turned out for the last of the 2007 Lakes Bikes races at Wandii. Three of the four races ended in a bunch sprint, the only exception being in the 58-67 year group where Geoff Marshall sprang away on the word 'go' never to be seen again by the bunch. However, Steph Ratcliffe chased hard, caught him and took the final sprint from his cramping compatriot – there wasn't a sympathetic word said by

the main bunch that was led in by Gary Boterhoven, Bill Crout and Derek McVickers!

In the oldest, 68 years plus division, Larry Ross was seen to be active in the early stages of the race when he opened up a fair lead. However, he thought better of it and came back to the fold, only to again jump away in the run for the line. Barry Eversden, in his first race for a few months was happy to take second place, while Derek Mayall managed to hold off Denis Robinson and the rest of the bunch when coming third.

At the other end of the spectrum, the 15 riders in the 35-47 year division proceeded at a decent pace but no successful moves took place to split up the field. Gary Wright took a long one on the final run to the finish but ran out of legs with about 40 metres to go, giving George Miller a clear road to the line. Ian O'Brien was a length or two behind, while Jason Rolfe and Gary Collett also passed Gary in his dying moments, leaving him to finish in fifth place. Unluckiest rider was Fred Landon who snapped a cable on his derailleur with a couple of laps to go. He chased valiantly after riding to the change quarters to grab another bike and finished the race.

Also with 15 starters, the 48-57 year age group saw quite a few attacks, the longest involving Keith Gill and Atilla Nagy (just fresh back from Europe), though they were brought back just before receiving the bell. Dave Berglund gave a powerful kick that caught his opponents napping and which no-one could match, and thus finished some 10 metres ahead of Dave Townson, Ian McFall, Wal Crowley and Keith Gill.

#### **7 October, 'Willing Homes' Age Div. Championships, Wandl**

Considering the large fields of almost 90-riders in the AWT 2-Day event, the turnout of 66 riders for the age div. championships was a bit disappointing, though all fields had sufficient riders to avoid combined division races (other than the female riders who rode in groups 10 years above their age, and our oldest rider Ray Craig who came third in his combined 70yrs plus event). Because of the large number of races, and so as to avoid elevating one 'champion' over another, we give just the bare results of the races. However, to mention the afflicted, Gary Collett was unluckiest rider of the day when he touched a wheel while in the winning breakaway in the 45-49 year age group and ended up with having to have stitches in his arm. Also in that group, Allan Clarke was the only puncture victim of the day. With pleasant conditions everyone rode hard, though the youngest group of six, with two invalids in their midst, decided to take it easy until the final 500 metres – so easy in fact, that the oldest age group

covered their circuits at a higher average speed! Congrats to all our 2007 medal winners. Thanks to Willing Homes for the sponsorship and to Doug Willing for both riding and helping out with the presentations.

### ***14 October, Peel CC, 'Tradelink' Spring Classic, 55km Group Handicap***

Another glorious day as far as the weather was concerned. The only problem was that a number of non-starters weakened a couple of the groups and this upset the handicaps. 'E' grade was the exception, and all 16 riders started. NOTE that if you nominate for a handicap you have an obligation to turn up – on this occasion 14 riders didn't – and neither did they ring to forewarn the organizers. Nevertheless the 64 who did turn out rode an interesting race and at the end there was only 45 seconds between scratch and the winners. For the first time in many years it was a 'D' grader, Allan Clarke, who pulled off the victory when he led in the 15-minute bunch just ahead of Bob Stephens, Ken Harvey and Chris Hunt. These riders took out not only the generous overall prizes, but also the excellent group prizes that went down to 7<sup>th</sup> place. Little wonder that there were lots of wide grins at the presentation, for in total there was \$2,500 up for grabs, making it the best paying one-day event of the year. Riding a steady 20 minutes a lap, the 'D' graders held 'C' grade, thus making it obvious for those on the line that it was going to come down to a close finish.

The combined bunch containing 'A' grade worked well to mop up those who started ahead and Russell Brookes took a comfortable sprint win ahead of Andrew Brierley and Doug Stewart for podium places – though 'B' grader Ian O'Brien split that group when just beating Doug

Stewart to the line. In the special category prizes, Sheona Clark rode strongly to take the 1<sup>st</sup> overall lady's prize, plus 3<sup>rd</sup> in 'E', while Ruth Haslam rode stoically to take out the 2<sup>nd</sup> lady's overall prize. Sheona also walked away with the special raffle prize of six bottles of wine – no doubt scoffed down by herself and Alan to celebrate the occasion.

There were two unfortunate incidents – the first in 'D' grade that saw Tony Speechley come out of the fray with grazes and a possible bone injury to a hand after a fall on the first corner - and (worst of all) a damaged machine. His fall also upset the group's chances, as three riders stopped behind to check the situation. The second involved a fall in which Gary Collett (his 2<sup>nd</sup> fall in two rides) and Wal Crowley came down. Wal was taken to hospital with suspected hip damage – we learn that he will be out of action for a few weeks, and wish him a full recovery. However, the only grumbles from those who rode was that some riders weren't pulling their weight, knowing there were group as well as overall pickings – a recognized hazard in this type of handicap race.
