RACE REPORTS

19th May – *Grades Scratch Races – Herne Hill*

What was expected to be a ‘freezer’ of a day turned out to be perfect racing weather that after a lap saw the line judges being bombarded by shed arm warmers. There was a

good field of 93 riders to herald the first road race of the season and there were a couple of epics to please the crowd gathered at the finish.

‘A’ grade started in fine style, when Julian Lowes put down his head to finish the first lap with a lead of 50seconds, However, just short of 10km later he had been absorbed by the peleton. There were a few other attempts to stir up the action with Andrew Lilley opening a slight gap on lap 3, while on the 5th lap there was a promising flight involving Andrew Lilley, Gavin Wark and Michael Tapscott. However, the bunch was too attentive to give them much hope and the race was closed down. In a 15-up sprint finish there was a close fight which was won by Brian Sing, with Bernie Swart close and Tom Perry close on his his wheel, in 3rd place and followed by Gavin Wark, Michael Tapscott, Martin Depiazzi and the rest of the field.

Paul Prottey showed he meant business when he moved to the head of affairs at the end of ‘B’ grade’s first circuit of the course. Two laps later it was again Paul Prottey who forced the pace but this time in the company of Greg Hendrie. With a lead of 15 seconds there was little money on their chances of staying ahead but a lap later the bets came in fast as they had put another 50 seconds into the bunch, with Magnus Rudisele being the only one to seriously try to bridge the gap. However, the duo didn’t wait for Magnus’s help and

kept their heads down, and lap by lap the gap increased until at the bell it had reached an unbeatable 2mins 45 seconds. That came down by 10 seconds at the finish line, leaving third place to fall to Mike Andrew who beat 24 other riders in a hectic sprint that saw a few weaving and bumping as they came at a hectic pace down the finishing straight. Mike was followed by Martin Dolinscheck, Owen Henderson and Cameron Keevers. Meanwhile, the 1st place had gone to Greg Hendrie who came around Paul with 30 metres to go. Their average speed of 39.9kph was 0.2kph faster than that recorded by the winner of 'A' grade. The dominance of Paul and Greg, came with its downside, as the handicapper no doubt marked them down as worthy of promotion to 'A' grade.

'C' grade saw a couple of attempts by Darren Lee to stretch his legs off the front of the 22- strong field but no one else tried any heroics, thus leaving the verdict to the finishing straight. Despite warnings by the referee one member who finished well ahead of the group, found the company of 'A' grade more attractive than that of his compatriots, and for his efforts he was demoted to the end of the field. This left it open for Damien Greig to take the laurels just ahead of one of the older members of the group, Nick Vroomans. Peter Wilshaw finish on his tail in 3rd place, followed by Richard Barville, Chris Fox and the rest of the field.

'D' grade started with 11 riders, though after a very long lay-off that was reduced to 10 when Mark Crowther decided that he needed a few more miles in his legs to be competitive. For most of the race the main group was chased by Clinton Hort and Shirley-Dow Vine, who kept up a fair pace though not fast enough to bring back the frontrunners. In a fast and furious sprint, the verdict went to Jarred Finnigan who surged over the final 30 metres to put a length into Rudi Seebach and Jonathan Akers. Jon Shattock was a close 4th, followed by Graham Blyth and Adrian Quick.

'E' grade started and finished with 10 riders, but after a lap or two the group was dominated by 5 riders, Anthony Clews on a comeback ride after damaging his shoulder in a car-related accident, Pantelis Karagoglou, Bob Stephens, Jon Dooner and Andrea Hind. In the sprint finish, they came across the line in that order, with Natalie Quick, Jane Crippa and Pat

Briggs following soon after. Derek Crowther and Kevin Hart had lonely rides but were pleased to just finish.

26 May – Graded Scratch Races, Dog Hill, Baldavis

Another bright and sunny day with early cool conditions that quickly turned to a comfortable 20 degrees saw some fast action in all grades. However, a slight cross breeze on the back of the course made it difficult for any of the 104 riders who found themselves off the back. Most riders avoided this by staying within the comfort of the bunch, resulting in most grades ending up with a mass sprint to the finish.

'A' grade saw some action, especially from Wayne Thomson and trial rider Chris Beck who attacked early in the race and also on on the penultimate lap to take a lead of 35seconds as they heard the bell. However, after a hard chase they were reeled in, leaving a happy Chris Brown to take a 2-length win over Chris Roberts and Colin Rose. Jon Gregg was a further 6 seconds behind, while Wayne Thomson still had sufficient strength to lead 6th placed Sam Smith over the line, closely followed by Brian Sing and another 9 riders.

'B' grade with 31 riders was the largest group of the day. There was little action in terms of breakaways, but that statement came from what was seen on the line each lap by the timekeepers, so should be taken with a pinch of salt! With 3 laps to go Richelle Gamble, Andrew Highfield and trial rider Dominic da Silva opened up a gap of 40 secs on the peleton but were caught by the beginning of the following lap. With 3 laps to go, Paul Lamond tried a solo, but his 5-second lead was soon annulled, leaving the group intact to contest a 26-strong sprint for the line. This was taken with ease by Dominic Da Silva, who distanced 2nd placed Michael Vreeken by about 3-lengths. Next in line were Darren Kinsella, Mark Anastasas, Patrick Woods, Paul Macintyre and Jon Liso, but as the winner was a trial rider all he took home was a piece of

paper, while the rest of the above named moved up a place to take the 6 cash prizes. Unluckiest rider was Greg Smith who suffered two punctures.

'C' grade's 18 riders rode at a fair pace, though there were no heroics, thus leaving the gifts for the sprinters. This resulted in a 14-up dash to the line at the end of their 6 laps that was won by David Menarry who just held off fast finishing Brett Clapham and Neil Vroomans to fill the podium places. Oldest rider in the group, Richard Barville finished 4th, followed in 5th and 6th by Anthony West and Darren Lee,

As with 'C' grade, 'D' grade started with 18 riders but according to reports from the field, attacks by Dianne McAuliffe stirred up the action to the detriment of some, and also saw her reign in potential breakaways on a number of occasions. Jonathan Akers and David Williams tried to open up a gap with 2 laps to go, but their 10-second lead as they passed the judges was insufficient to worry the chasers. With 14 riders left as they approached the line it was Rudi Seebach who proved fastest when he beat John Shattock and Jarrad Finnigan by about two lengths, with David Williams, Fermin Blanco Mayo and Mark Williamson finishing 5th, 6th and 7th respectively. Dianne McAuliffe who had the valiant work mentioned previously, finished 8th, being the last rider in the lead bunch.

'E' grade rode with a respectable field of 14 riders containing newly returned Peter Fitzsimmons, Edward Rose and Jane McIntyre. As with other grades there were few attempts for individuals or pairs to test the field, though a close eye was kept on Pantelis Karagoglou, something that possibly dampened the pace. As is often the case, this played into the hands (or legs) of the sprinters, leaving Edward Rose to enjoy the win, with Graham Thornton 2nd, Pantelis Karagoglou in 3rd, followed by Jon Dooner Pat Briggs, and Doc Lawrance. In 7th, 8th and 9th were the female contingent of Jane McIntyre, Andrea Hind and Natalie Quick.

Lap times all around were respectable, with 'A' grade averaging 15m 35secs per lap; 'B' grade 16m 35secs; 'C'

grade 16m 50secs; 'D' grade 18m 10secs, and 'E' grade 20m 30secs.

2nd June - Graded Scratch Races, Chidlow 'A'

Summer goes on and on and today's event was run in ideal sunny conditions. Being a long-weekend, numbers were down to 69 riders, as some members attended to family concerns, but the racing was again of a high standard.

'A' grade witnessed its usual hard riding punctuated by breakaways, the first taking place on lap 2 when Sam Smith got away in the company of Innes Davie to a lead of 50 seconds. On the following lap the peleton had reduced the lead by 15 seconds, while at the halfway mark, with 4 laps to go the breakaway duo had been joined by Michael Tapscott. Michael must have put fire into the break, for with two laps to go the gap had increased to 1m 15seconds, and at the bell the trio were almost 2 minutes ahead of the peleton, with Mitchell Fitzgerald valiantly fighting in-between in no-man's land. Somewhere on the final lap, Sam Smith put his head down to draw ahead and to finish 20 seconds ahead of Innes Davie, with another 16 seconds to Michael Tapscott. Mitchell Fitzgerald was able to keep a distance from the peleton by 25 seconds, with Greg Hendre and Andrew Turnbull being 5th and 6th another 20 seconds behind.

'B' grade also saw a similar scenario to that in 'A'. On the 1st lap Andrew Highfield showed intent when passing the timekeeper 10 seconds ahead of the yet compact peleton. With 3 laps to go he was joined by Paul Borrett, with Paul George strengthening the break with 2 laps to go when the lead had increased to 30 seconds. At the bell another 10 seconds was added to their lead and though the gap was reduced

they managed to stay clear by 11 seconds from 14 chasers. In a closely contested sprint Paul George proved the fastest, with Andrew Highfield just beating 3rd place Paul Borrett across the line. Darren Kinsella led in the main bunch with Rodney King, John Liso and Neil Roscoe glued on his wheel. Twenty-two of the nominated 23 riders finished, with the only rider not to record a time being a disappointed Steele Bishop who had signed in but did not start because of a mechanical problem with a wheel.

The 18 riders in 'C' grade followed their usual pattern by riding in a compact group for much of the event, though it was noted that Vanessa Johnson appeared to be spearheading the bunch on a couple of the 6 laps. This was also the situation at the bell when Vanessa was again at the head of affairs but this time with a 20-seconds lead and a determined look on her face. If the bunch believed she would weaken, they were wrong, but it was a closerun result, for coming up to the line, the hounds were in full flight and closing rapidly. In a nail biter, it took the transponder to determine the finish, which went to a delighted Vanessa over Chris Fox, and David Ellis by a mere 0.006 seconds. Two seconds later Peter Wilshaw finished 4th just ahead of John Hanson, Quaid Smith, with Keith Hickey leading in 4 other riders a further 3 seconds behind.

'D' grade saw the smallest field of the day with only 6 riders, and while coming past the finish line each lap at a fair pace there were too few competitors to cause drama. The race was eventually decided by a three-up sprint in which Rudi Seebach emerged the winner, with Jonathan Akers a close 2nd, and Graham Blyth 3rd. Adrian Quick was 8 seconds behind and Nick Cowie in 5th was last to finish. Kevin Dolman had a hard time on the hills and DNF'd with a lap to go.

'E' grade's 9 riders were in combative mood as shown when on lap one Bob Stephens and Michael Barr headed a split field. This was Michael's first race in 30-years and he was determined to make his presence felt. The two leaders were still at the head of affairs on the 2nd lap but had by then been joined by Graham Thornton and Jane Crippa. That was till the order as they came past the line for the final lap, but Michael Barr decided to attack before hitting the final climbs, and although Bob

Stephens counter-attacked he was unable to bring Michael back. The latter went on to record a come-back win by 38 seconds, while 2nd placed Bob Stephens crossed the line 8 seconds ahead of Graham Thornton, with Jan at another 5 seconds. Natalie Quick was 5th, while Doc Lawrance, not renown as a lover of hills was 6th, followed by Pat Briggs. Both Pat and Bob Stephens had appeared on the scene while it was still dark to set out the signs, a fact that was appreciated by those at the prize-presentation who acknowledged their sacrifice.

9 June - Graded Scratch Races, Pickering Brook

Ye of little faith! With dire warnings of thunder, hail and high winds, only 27 brave souls turned out for the races at Pickering Brook – and guess what? – there were only two showers and the sun even shone between. Because of the numbers it was decided to combine some of the grades, so that 'D' rode with 'E', and 'A' started with 'B', while the eight riders in 'C' rode as one entity.

As agreed before the start, 'A' and 'B' stayed together for a couple of laps, after which 'A' attacked to distance themselves from their brethren. While 'A' continued to battle with each other as a compact group, 'B' grade split into three small groups halfway through their race, with the winner being four minutes behind the winner of 'A' grade.

In a closely contested sprint it was Jon Gregg who took the honours in 'A' grade, with the other two rostrum places being taken respectively by Brian Sing and trial rider Daniel Griffiths. Tom O'Neill was 4th, followed by Colin Rose and Mark Hamill, while Gavin Wark found the hills in 'A' grade steeper than those before he was promoted to 'A'.

'B' Grade saw a couple of splits in its ranks after completing 5 of their 9 laps, and at the bell the first small group was further split when David Sofield jumped the bunch to take a 15-seconds lead. The chasers failed to bridge the gap leaving him with 12 seconds to spare at the conclusion of the race over Patrick Woods, Paul Borrett and Neil Roscoe.

'C' grade rode steadily together until two of their 7 laps to go. Putting in effort, Keith Hickey and trial rider Graham Gardner put distance between themselves and Nick Vroomans and Andrew Stevens when finishing 2 minutes 22 seconds ahead at the finish. Neil Vroomans was another 4 seconds behind in 5th place.

'D' grade and 'E' split soon after the start of their 5-lap race, but 'D' lost 50% of its riders when Sam Bolton punctured and abandoned. This left Mark Williamson to eventually sample the sweet fruits of success. In turn Bob Stephens dropped his compatriot Pat Briggs early in the race, ensuring that both enjoyed a time trial to the finish where they were cheered on by our only spectator, Brian Kennedy!

16 June - Graded Scratch Races, Mt Helena

After the rains of the previous week the 55 members who turned out at Mt Helena were relieved to see some sunshine, and though there was a slight chill at the beginning, all had warmed up nicely by the time they completed the 1st lap. The beauty of writing up the account of a 20km circuit is that because the report is based on what is seen at the start/finish line, very few observations are made. Thus, while I was told by one rider that there were lots of challenging attempts to break up the bunch in 'C' grade, from my vantage point all I saw was a fast,

compact moving bunch passing four times over the line.

'A' grade saw action by Colin Rose, Wayne Thomson and Michael Tapscott on the 1st of their 4 laps, the trio taking a lead of 10 seconds over the bunch. With 2 laps to go the break had been contained and at the bell Colin Rose was in front of the chasers by 5 seconds. With the bunch all together as they came to the last rise to the finish it took a determined surge by Innes Davies to overcome James MacWatt and Shaun O'Neill across the line by 3 seconds, with the remainder of the field close behind. The average speed was 40.313kph – a very reasonable speed on the hilly circuit.

Viewed from the line, 'B' grade saw no gaps, except at the ringing of the bell when Gavin Wark held a lead of 5 seconds. This proved too little and he was soon brought to heel. The finish saw another close bunch finish with Rodney King beating Darren Kinsella and John Liso by 1.5seconds. Steele Bishop was a close 4th followed by another four – Gavin Lawson, Neil Roscoe, Paul Borrett, and Jan-Paul Grygorcewicz - all within 4 seconds of the winner.

'C' grade started with 20 riders, just one more than 'B' grade and 10 more than in 'A', with some of 'A' grade's regulars having ridden at a nearby CA race at Chidlow. The peleton stayed together and rode at a respectable pace. At the finish it was Dave Ellis who took the laurels, closely followed at 1.5seconds by a surprised Brett Clapham who stated he was unused to seeing himself podium on an uphill finish. He was closely followed by Jonathan Akers, Graham Gardner, David Varcoe, Anthony West, Simon Vandenberg and a host of others.

In 'D' grade's field, half were burnt off the back on the 1st of their 3-lap event. This meant that both Sam Bolton and Tony Clews had lonely rides. Sam finished 2nd, while Tony was 3rd.

'E' graded started with four riders, double that of 'D', but an anti-social Bob Stephens soon parted from his compatriots to front the rest of the field by 50 seconds on the 1st of their two laps. However, Graham Thornton continued the fight and when finishing 2nd found that he had substantially reduced the gap. Pat Briggs was a distant 3rd, while Denis Robinson, the only Octogarian to

ride on the day, decided that one lap was enough to satisfy his week's training.

30 June - Graded Scratch, Chidlow 'A'

Another day that defied the weather forecasts in that it didn't rain. However, the roads were damp and there was a chill in the air, but the conditions did little to dampen the spirits of the 52 riders who rode on the Chidlow 'A's' undulating circuit.

Greg Gale shone on the 2nd of 'A' grade's eight laps when he moved to a lead of 15seconds. On the third lap Greg's place at the front was taken by Jon Gregg and Brian Sing, who quickly distanced the opposition to gain a commanding and unbridgeable lead of over four minutes with 3 laps to go. Jon took the sprint from Brian when opening a gap of four lengths, while Michael Tapscott was third at 5minutes 33 seconds behind. Three seconds later Greg Gale held off Matt Upton and a long and widely dispersed straggle of riders when finishing in third place.

'B' Grade saw attacking riding by David Sofield and Greg Stewart who opened up a gap of 55seconds on the first lap. That was reduced by about a half at the end of the next circuit, after which both were overtaken by Steele Bishop and Paul Borrett. Riding steadily the duo went on to increase their lead lap by lap, so that with 2 laps to go they were 2mins 35secs ahead. Though the chasers were resigned to defeat from the ex-World Pro champion and Paul Borrett, the final lap saw fireworks behind as the peleton tore itself apart in their fight for third place. Meanwhile Steele sprinted strongly as they entered the finishing straight to beat Paul by about 4 or 5 lengths, while it was Darren Kinsella who led in the distanced stragglers who crossed the line in one's and two's.

There was only one word to describe 'C' grade – 'Slow', as their lap average was about 2 minutes a lap slower than their last ride on the circuit and their average of 31.1kph was equalled by 'D' grade. David Varcoe was a bright light in the 17-strong field when he rode off the front to hold a lead of 15 seconds for the first two laps. He was caught halfway through the event but then went away again before once more being brought back top the fold. Over the final couple of laps the bunch were attentive and unprepared to let anyone get away. However, the final lap witnessed a number of attacks that weakened the field to cause gaps to appear. The event culminated in Graham Gardner confidently sprinting to a

two-second win over Graham Begg, who in turn headed John Hanson by another 4 seconds. Three riders, Brett Clapham, Neil Vroomans and trial rider Aaron Caratti failed to finish after misfortune, with all suffering punctures or mechanical trouble.

What was interesting about 'D' grade was that of the six entrants, four were women. Following his long layoff, Tony Clews found his fitness wanting and with discretion proving stronger than valour, he resigned his place for the remaining five compatriots to complete the course. This saw Kirsty Jones, Dianne McAuliffe and Mark Williamson get together at the end of their 2nd circuit for a lead of 20 seconds. Yael Gardner on her 2nd ride with the club chased valiantly behind but neither she nor Sam Bolton were able to make any impression on the lead trio. On the rise to the finish, the three escapees sprinted hard with the win going to Mark who finished 13 seconds ahead of Dianne and Kirsty.

'E' grade saw Pat Briggs start in a borrowed pair of shoes and helmet as a result of a rock being thrown through the side-window of his car sometime during the night, and his bag being taken – how useful will an used pair of cleated shoes and a tatty helmet going be to the louse who snatched them? The shoes did little to make it a comfortable ride for Pat and as the laps went on, he fell further behind. With Graham Thornton not enjoying a good day, this left Bob Stephens, John Gargioni and Jane Crippa to get together to ride to the finish. In the sprint to the line John gained a two-second advantage over Bob, while Jane finished another 2 seconds behind to take 3rd place.

28 July - Graded Scratch Races, Pickering Brook

Back after a break and pleased to report that the weather was perfect – probably the first time ever that folk have felt warm and comfortable on this course. Following the previous two nights when landslides caused confusion on Le Tour, it is relevant to report that we also experienced a minor landslide on the Pickering Brook circuit, but that rather than abandon the event a couple of our trusty marshals tackled the fall with brushes, and our valiant Coureurs tackled the circuit with aplomb, after being informed that any further landslides would see positions being determined by times being taken on the top of Repatriation Hill.

Of the 62 riders, the largest grade was 'B', with 31 entrants. This was followed by 'C' with 15, 'A' with 10, 'D;' with 6 and 'E' with

5 riders. One interesting statistic is that both 'A' and 'B' grades both recorded an average of 12m 05secs per lap, suggesting that its time for a melding of the grades!

Both 'A' and 'B' saw successful breakaways, both involving three riders. 'A' grades' Colin Rose showed early promise when going away with Brett Schnitzerling for a 25 seconds lead at the end of lap one. Brett then moved back to the comfort of the bunch, while a couple of laps later Colin was joined by Matt Upton and Sam Smith. Later in the race the bunch split into three groups with the situation seeing Sam Smith, Luke Pledger and Brian Sing holding a lead of 1m 50secs with three laps to go, a lead that was reduced by 35 seconds on the next lap. The event ended with Sam Smith riding to a 15 seconds lead over Luke Pledger, who was a further three seconds ahead of Brian Sing. Paul Prottey finished a further 2 minutes behind when leading in Shaun Oneill and Matt Upton. Average time per lap was 12m 05secs, or 38.3kph.

'B' grade followed a similar pattern when Magnus Rudisele stirred up the action on lap two when taking a lead of 15 seconds. However, his heroics were short lived, with the lead being taken by Greg Gale, Mark Welford and Greg Bayley. With a lead of 25 seconds with 5 laps to go, they steadily pulled ahead to increase their lead to 1minute 15secs at the bell. In a tight sprint, victory went to Greg Gale, with Mark Welford in 2nd and Greg Bayley in 3rd place. Sixteen riders were present to contest forth place with the honours going to Staurt Murray, ahead of Darin Dunstan, John Liso, Jon-Paul Grygorcewicz and the rest of the pack. As with 'A' grade, the average time per lap was 12m 05secs, or 38.3kph.

C' grade also saw a breakaway, though this one was a solo ride by Quaid Smith who after three laps opened up a gap of 35 seconds. Riding strongly, his lead increased to 1m 20secs with three to go, while at the bell he had an unassailable lead of 2m 5secs. However, the final lap saw action from the bunch, which at the finish had reduced the lead to 1min 30 seconds. Second across the line was Graham Gardner, followed closely by Tony Smith, trial rider David Collins and 1st lady

finisher Michelle McLintock, David Ellis was another 6 seconds behind in 6th place. 'C' grade recorded 13m 25secs per lap or 34.8kph.

'D' grade with its 6 riders split early in the race, with Bruce Abbott returning after his accident abandoning after finding the going too tough for his state of fitness. Mark Williamson, Dianne McAuliffe and trial rider John Winteringham dominated most of the race but on the final couple of laps, John was dropped, leaving Mark and Dianne to fight out the finish, with Mark crossing in 1st place. However, with three wins to his name, the victory probably spelled the end of his domination, as he looks to promotion to 'C' grade. Sam Bolton finished alone to take 4th place, while Yael Gardner finished 5th after a long pursuit. The average time per lap was 14m 50secs per lap, or 31.4kph

John Gargioni in 'E' grade was the first to pull away from the field after two laps, when he recorded a lead of 15seconds. A lap later he was joined by Bob Stephens, and the duo rode together to contest the sprint, which was won by John after Bob kicked a little too late to beat his adversary. Natalie Quick soloed to 3rd place and was followed by Jon Dooner and finally Graham Thornton. The first riders averaged 16m 25secs per lap or 28.4kph.

11th August – 6 Laps (57km) Memorial Handicap, Herne Hill

Despite bright conditions and pleasant temperatures, the handicap Memorial only attracted 53 riders. As this event usually attracts over 100 riders, and there were no other cycling events to draw riders away, the question is ‘where have all the riders gone’?

With reduced numbers, the handicappers had to juggle with not only working out possible times for each grade, but also the effect of numbers in each grade on their respective speeds. Their efforts were not far out, as the winning group finished just 1m 20secs ahead of the bulk of the chasers. The favourite for the win was ‘B’ grade with 16 riders, especially as a strong wind bore down on riders off the escarpment, to make it particularly hard on Oakover and Campersic Roads. However, a drop in speed on the 4th lap that lost ‘B’ about a minute proved their undoing, for they were caught by ‘A’ grade just before the finish. Twenty-six riders were within 2m 53secs of the winner, with the overall sprint being taken by ‘C’ grade’s Brett Clapham in a well-judged sprint that saw him finish a couple of lengths ahead of David Ellis, Quaid Smith and Nick Vroomans. Fellow ‘C’ graders Alan Nicholls, Iain Dow Vine and David Varcoe filled the first 7 places, while first of the chasers, some 1m 21s behind, was ‘A’ grade’s Brian Sing. Fellow ‘A’ grader Greg Hendrie was 9th, ‘B’ grader Gavin Wark 10th, ‘A’ grader Steele Bishop 11th, and Craig Huxtable for ‘B’ grade 12th – all in the same time as Brian Sing.

As prizemoney went to the first three in each grade, those outside the first three overall were also happy – even more so, the overall winners who also took the grade prizes. I leave it to you to work out the grade winners from the following results:

Leo Enright kindly added \$50 to Brian Sing's envelope for taking out the fastest time. There were 12 non-finishers.

At the presentation, the President read out the names of departed members from the Memorial Roll of Honour, and added the name of Hank Vogels (snr), who had sadly passed away towards the end of the week, to that list.

18 August - Graded Scratch Races - Casuarina

Another perfect day, with blue skies, pleasant temperatures and hardly a breath of wind, but once again a small turnout of 54 riders confounded the usual masses packing the verges. Two excuses were offered: tired legs for those who had ridden the previous day's Collie Handicap event; and a large attendance at the Henk Vogels commemoration ride in the City. However, that didn't dampen the action and the times recorded were on par with previous events.

'B' grade once again had the largest field of the day with 24 riders, though that number contained 5 riders taking a first trial ride. On the second lap Darren Kinsella, David McFerran, Greg Bayley and Magnus Rudisele headed the rest by 10 seconds, but only Magnus remained at the start of the following lap, again with a small lead of 10 seconds. A more promising break consisting of David McFarren, Mark Taylor, Magnus Rudisele, Peter Wilshaw, and trial rider Wilson Kwan emerged on lap 4 to build up a lead that increased from 15 seconds to 30 seconds by lap 5. However, the main peleton brought the lead down by 10 seconds on Lap 6 and the break was absorbed with 2 laps to go. Taking the

opportunity of a lull in the pace, Greg Bayley attacked to open a gap of 10 seconds. At the bell he had added another 5 seconds and ended the race with the ride of the day. With 300 metres to go he sat up to free wheel across the finishing line with 5 seconds in hand. Eleven riders competed for the other podium places, with the verdict going to Jason Roberts and Craig Huxtable. Trial rider Hereward Holmes was a close 4th, John Liso 5th and Mark Anastasas 6th.

The eight riders in 'A' grade rode a cautious race with no obvious breaks occurring during the duration of the race. Circling the course at a steady pace ranging from 12m 30secs to 12m 50secs per lap, the only exception was the final lap which was completed in 12m 5secs. That had the effect of burning off three riders, leaving 5 of them to contest the sprint. This saw a strong finish by Bernie Swart who finished a length ahead of Greg Gale and Colin Rose, with Ian Lyne, and Andrew Lilley in 4th and 5th places respectively.

'C' grade with 16 riders was equally placid on the day with 'A' grade, the only small break being viewed on lap 3 when Paul McMurtrie moved to a lead of 5 seconds. Consequently, there was a mass sprint involving all 16 riders, with Jason Hapeta leading in Damien Greig, Paul McMurtrie and Neil Vroomans, with David Ellis and Nick Vroomans filling the rest of the first six places.

'D' grade started with a miniscule field of four riders, though that was reduced to 3 when Nick Cowie, suffering from lack of training miles called it a day with a lap to go. In a hard-contested finish, the winners laurel went to Lawrence Fahey, who finished a length ahead of Jarred Finnigan and 3rd placed Tony Clews.

'E' grade started with an even smaller field than 'D' grade when three riders faced the starter, all three of them certain of glory. All laps were ridden steadily in the mid 16-minute range, except for one 17-minute ride on the final lap, no doubt the result of 'foxing' by the contestants. Pantelis Karagoglou won the contest, with Bob Stephens a couple of lengths behind, while Natalie Quick finished a few seconds later.
